Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady: Tuesday August 15th is a Holyday of Obligation. Mass in St Peter's Church at 12noon and 7.00pm.

Love the Stranger: Is a new publication from the Department for International Affairs of the Bishops Conference of England and Wales that presents a Catholic response to migrants and refugees. It places the human being at the heart of our pastoral outreach, looking beyond statistics and policies to the person – each with a name, a face and a story. The document offers 24 guiding principles and has been endorsed by the Holy See, COMECE, CAFOD, CSAN and Caritas Social Action Network members. Visit www.cbcew.org.uk to view the document. Receiving Holy Communion: Those who receive Communion may receive either in the hand or on the tongue, and the decision should be that of the individual receiving, not of the person distributing Holy Communion. If Communion is received in the hand, the hands should, first of all be clean. If one is right handed the left hand should rest upon the right. The Sacred Host will then be laid in the palm of the left hand and then taken by the right hand to the mouth. If one is left-handed this is reversed. The person distributing Communion says audibly to each person approaching, "The Body of Christ", "The Blood of Christ". This formula is a proclamation which calls for a response of faith on the part of the one who receives. The communicant should audibly respond, "Amen," indicating by that response his or her belief that this small wafer of bread, the wine in this chalice are in reality the Body and Blood of Christ the Lord. It is not appropriate to reach out with the fingers and take the Sacred Host from the person distributing Holy Communion under the form of bread. When receiving in the hand, the communicant should be guided by the words of St. Cyril of Jerusalem: "When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart, but rather place your left hand as a throne beneath your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive Him, taking care that nothing is lost." It is never permissible for a person to dip the Sacred Host he or she has received into the chalice (intinction). If, for some reason, the communicant is not able or willing to drink from the chalice then that person should receive only under the form of bread.
