First Holy Communion 2022: Over 90 children have applied to make their first Holy Communion in 2022. First Holy Communion Day is always a very special time in the life of children, their families and parish. Preparing children for First Holy Communion doesn't just happen. We are so grateful to the catechists and helpers who have been running the parish-based preparation programme for the past number of years. With so many children having applied for next year, we need more catechists and helpers. Do please consider offering yourself. Preparation classes (about 6) take place on a Friday evening. To offer yourself or to find out more of what is involved, please speak to one of the parish clergy.

Now Accepting Contactless Donations: You will find our new DIGITAL COLLECTION PLATE, contactless terminal in the church, just by the repository door. Just use your contactless debit/credit card or smart phone/ device to make a donation. Simply choose the amount you wish to donate and hold your card onto the reader. You can also opt-in for Gift Aid to increase your donation by 25%. If you are a UK taxpayer then donating with Gift Aid means that we can claim an extra 25p for every £1 received. Contactless donations are simple to administer, secure and convenient.

Peace Sunday: Next Sunday, January 16th is Peace Sunday. The theme of Pope Francis' message this year is *Dialogue between Generations, Education, Work and Dialogue: Tools for Building Lasting Peace.* Pax Christi, the international Catholic movement for peace, takes the lead in providing resources for Peace Sunday. Its National President, Archbishop Malcolm McMahon of Liverpool, says: *"This year has been one of unprecedented and continuing challenges. We are all conscious of the need to restore and rebuild our communities here and around the world, accepting that we need new ways of working and relating to each other. <i>"The Christian message of peace, through reconciliation, justice and nonviolence, can offer hope and direction in these times."* Visit www.paxchristi.org.uk for more details and to read Pope Francis' message.

Bishops Conference Practical Guidance for Churches: With respect to the current situation with the Omicron variant it is important to ensure the following points are followed in our churches:

People displaying any symptoms of Covid-19 should stay at home and not travel to church.

Face coverings must be worn by those attending public acts of worship unless there is a genuine exemption.

That there is good ventilation and air throughput in the building; in this case, because of climatic conditions, it would be important to wrap up well in church.

Mobile Phones: Please ensure that mobile phones are on silent while in church.

Diocesan Pilgrimage to the Holy Land: Bishop Declan is leading a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2022 (Monday 26 September to Tuesday 4 October 2022) staying three nights in Galilee, two nights in Bethlehem, and three nights in Jerusalem. The estimated costings indicate a figure of £1,879 per person (based on two people sharing). We currently have **19 places remaining** on the pilgrimage, please do let us know as soon as you can if you are interested.
