Covering of Crosses and Statues: We are observing the custom of veiling the crosses and statues in church. It is a practice observed from a time when the Passion was read on the Fifth Sunday of Lent marking the beginning of Passiontide (last two weeks of Lent).

National Day of Reflection: Cardinal Vincent Nichols and Archbishop Malcolm McMahon writing on behalf of the Bishops Conference of England and Wales said: "We welcome the designation of Tuesday the 23rd March as a National Day of Reflection to mark the anniversary of the first national lockdown with a minute's silence at midday and doorstep vigils of light at 8.00pm. We ask you all to make this not only a Day of Reflection but also a Day of Prayer. In reflection we ponder on all that has taken place; in prayer we bring this to our Heavenly Father. For all who live by faith in God, reflection and prayer always go hand in hand. Prayer completes reflection. Reflection informs prayer. Prayer opens our life to its true horizon. Without prayer we live in a foreshortened world and are more easily swamped by its clamour and tragedy. Throughout this difficult year, so many have been inspired by prayer, so much effort sustained in prayer, in every place. So let us make the 23rd March truly a day of prayer." There will be an additional time of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesday beginning at 5.00pm.

Summary of the Holy Father's words at the General Audience last Wednesday, March 17th

Dear Brothers and Sisters, in our catechesis on Christian prayer, we have seen that through prayer we share in the life of the blessed Trinity, thanks to Christ's gift of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit in fact teaches us to pray, making Christ present and active in our lives and in our world. In the Spirit we are enabled to call God our Father, to live our vocation to holiness, and to carry out our baptismal mission as witnesses of Christ's redemptive and merciful love. Through prayer and works of charity we open our lives to the Spirit's gifts, following in the footsteps of countless saints who have gone before us. The Catechism tells us that there are as many paths of prayer as there are persons who pray, but it is the same Spirit acting in all and with all. In the communion of the Holy Spirit Christian prayer is prayer in the Church (cf. No. 2672). In our prayer, let us ask the Spirit to guide us in our daily lives, to draw us ever more fully into the life of the Blessed Trinity, and bestow upon the Church the richness of his gifts for the growth of our human family in unity and peace.

There will be no Procession. The shorter form of the Passion from the Gospel of St Mark will be read. Blessed Palm Branches will be distributed to the faithful as they leave the church after Mass.

Monday of Holy Week (March 29th)

The Washing of Feet is omitted. There is no Procession to the Altar of Repose and no Watching. The Blessed Sacrament is reserved in the Tabernacle and the altar is not stripped.

GOOD FRIDAY (April 2nd)

9.00am: Office of Readings & Morning Prayer 10.30am: Children's Way of the Cross (live stream only) 12noon: Stations of the Cross

3.00pm: Liturgy of the Lord's Passion (Fully Booked)
5.30pm: Liturgy of the Lord's Passion (Limited Availability)

An additional prayer will be added to the Universal Prayer for the afflicted in time of pandemic. Individual Veneration of the Cross will be replaced by a few minutes of Silent Veneration. A retiring collection will be taken for the Holy Places in Palestine.

7.30pm: Prayer beneath the Cross (live stream only)

HOLY SATURDAY (April 3rd)

9.00am: Office of Readings & Morning Prayer

7.00pm: Easter Vigil & First Mass of Easter (Fully Booked)

There is no Easter Fire. The Paschal Candle will be prepared, lit and placed in the Sanctuary before the faithful gather in church. There are no individual candles. The shorter form of the Exsultet will be proclaimed. The Liturgy of the Word will consist of three Old Testament readings (Genesis 22:1-18; Exodus 14:15-15:1; Isaiah 55:1-11), a New Testament Reading (Romans 6:3-11) and the Gospel (Mark 16:1-7). There is no celebration of Baptism or Reception into Full Communion of the Catholic Church. The water is blessed but the faithful are not sprinkled with it.

EASTER SUNDAY (April 4th)

Easter Day Mass 9.00am, 10.30am, 5.30pm.

The renewal of Baptismal Promises will take place but without the sprinkling with the Blessed Water Polish Language Mass 12.30pm & 2.00pm.
