SUSPENDING SUNDAY AND WEEKDAY MASSES

With immediate effect all Sunday and weekday masses in St Peter's Church are suspended until further notice. This follows a decree issued by Bishop Declan on Thursday in line with the guidance of the Bishops of England and Wales. The obligation to attend Mass on a Sunday or Holyday of Obligation is removed until further notice. During this time St Peter's Church will be open each day for parishioners to have a time for individual prayer, without any organised services. Parishioners may choose one of the following alternatives to attending Sunday/Weekday Mass:

- Taking part may include watching Mass online or on television and so receive Holy Communion spiritually. Check the diocesan website for details of Mass online from our Cathedral Church of St Peter and St Paul. Churchservices.tv is also a good website to visit. The following prayer for a Spiritual Communion can be said:
 - My Jesus, I believe that you are present in this Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and I passionately desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul, so that I may unite myself wholly to you now and forever. Amen.
- Reflecting of the Sunday Liturgical text, reading the Bible, saying the Rosary, praying the Prayer of the Church (Divine Office). The iBreviary app or universalis.com can be accessed to aid prayer.

Priests will say a private daily mass for the intentions of parishioners at this difficult time.

Baptisms, confirmations will no longer be celebrated until such time when public health advice is that congregations can gather safely.

Confession may be offered on request as long as hygiene and social distancing requirements are observed. However please be aware that as Fr Liam needs to self isolate due to his chemotherapy therapy he will not be available to hear confessions.

Funeral services should now take place at either the graveside or crematorium. Arrangements for the Mass to be celebrated *in memoriam* can be arranged when congregations are allowed to gather safely.

Pope Francis has composed a prayer to Our Lady, Health of the Sick, to implore her protection during the Covid-19 coronavirus pandemic.

O Mary, you shine continuously on our journey as a sign of salvation and hope. We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick. Year of Communion - Sunday March 22nd - 4th Sunday of Lent

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives sight to a man born blind. First, he can see physically and then with the eyes of faith. We too, through baptism, have been given the eyes of faith, but we can struggle to see what it is that God is asking of us. Through our sinfulness, we can find ourselves overwhelmed by darkness.
