Sunday of the Word of God: Instituted by Pope Francis in 2020 to be held every year on the third Sunday of Ordinary Time, reminds us of the importance and value of Sacred Scripture for the Christian life, as well as the relationship between the word of God and the liturgy: "As Christians, we are one people, making our pilgrim way through history, sustained by the Lord, present in our midst, who speaks to us and nourishes us. A day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the Risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and to break bread in the community of believers. For this reason, we need to develop a closer relationship with Sacred Scripture; otherwise, our hearts will remain cold and our eyes shut, inflicted as we are by so many forms of blindness". *Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments 2020*

Synod 2023: Pope Francis has called a Synod, focusing on the themes of Communion, Participation and Mission. There are three ways in which you can be involved in St Peter's Parish response to the Synodal Process: There are two Synod Listening events taking place in St Peter's Church on Tuesday 25th January after the 7.00pm Mass, and Friday 28th January after the 9:30am Mass. At these meetings there is an opportunity to listen to each other's reflections on the Synodal process. 'Listening Walls' have been installed on four panels in the narthex of the Church. Post-it notes are provided on the table for you to make your comments.

There are also handouts available at the back of the Church to help prepare for the Listening events, or to help us reflect ourselves, and with family and friends. Completed handouts can be left in the box provided at the back of the Church or emailed to stephen.corrigan@cliftondiocese.com.
