From the message of Pope Francis for this Season of Lent

In our Lenten journey towards Easter, let us remember the One who "humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross" (*Phil* 2:8). During this season of conversion, let us renew our *faith*, draw from the "living water" of *hope*, and receive with open hearts the *love* of God, who makes us brothers and sisters in Christ. At the Easter vigil, we will renew our baptismal promises and experience rebirth as new men and women by the working of the Holy Spirit. This Lenten journey, like the entire pilgrimage of the Christian life, is even now illumined by the light of the resurrection, which inspires the thoughts, attitudes and decisions of the followers of Christ. *Fasting, prayer and almsgiving*, as preached by Jesus (cf. *Mt* 6:1-18), enable and express our conversion. The path of poverty and self-denial (*fasting*), concern and loving care for the poor (*almsgiving*), and childlike dialogue with the Father (*prayer*) make it possible for us to live lives of sincere faith, living hope and effective charity. *www.vatican.va*

Countdown to COP26 for the Care of Creation: Second week of Lent

The parable of the Mustard Seed; Mark 4.30

The mustard seed produces a huge bush that shelters the birds. Life also emerges from tiny beginnings and the whole web of life supports all life, from insects and microbes to animals fish birds and people. What if the tree is shaken, so that branches are broken off, leaves ripped from the branches? This is not in the parable but is what is happening to our world. It no longer provides reliable seasons in many places, and indeed many people are suffering from repeated 'natural disasters' now, attributable to human activity by scientists. How sad this is.
